



## Summary of Injunction Proceedings – For KDDAUK Records

### Summary of Injunction Proceedings – For KDDAUK Records

**Matter:** KDDAUK v. Former Officers

**Type of Application:** Interim Injunction

**Court:** County Court at Central London

**Outcome Date:** 20/02/2026

**Prepared by:** Community Legal Centre (CLC)

#### 1. Purpose of the Application

Mr Sahr Stephen Kabba and Mr Tamba Theophilus Gborie, former officers from KDDAUK sought an interim injunction to prevent the KDDAUK's Interim Committee to provide essential continuity for the organisation.

- Holding themselves out as current KDDAUK officials
- Interfering with KDDAUK's governance
- Accessing or using KDDAUK's organisational assets
- Taking steps that could mislead the public or undermine the charity's lawful leadership

The application was falsely made by Mr Sahr Stephen Kabba and Mr Tamba Theophilus Gborie falsifying Court papers under the cover to protect the organisation's operations, reputation, and governance structure while internal and legal processes continued.

#### 2. Court's Decision

The Court dismissed the injunction when it discovered the fraud. This is in favour of KDDAUK's Interim Committee. The order confirmed:

- Mr Sahr Stephen Kabba and Mr Tamba Theophilus Gborie the claimants are **restrained** from representing themselves as KDDAUK officers or acting on behalf of the organisation.
- They must **not interfere** with KDDAUK's activities, communications, or public representation.
- KDDAUK's Interim Committee is recognised as the **lawful leadership** for the purposes of the proceedings.

This provided immediate protection to the charity and prevented further disruption.

### 3. Costs Award

The Court ordered the respondents to pay KDDAUK's assessed costs in the sum of:

**£3,142.50**

This amount has now been **paid in full** into the KDDAUK account, and the costs aspect of the injunction matter is formally concluded.

### 4. Impact and Significance

The failed injunction:

- Stabilised KDDAUK's governance during a period of dispute
- Prevented unauthorised individuals from acting in the charity's name
- Protected KDDAUK's reputation and public standing
- Ensured clarity for members, partners, and external bodies
- Strengthened KDDAUK's position for any future civil proceedings

The Court's recognition of the Interim Committee provided essential legitimacy and continuity for the organisation.

### 5. Next Steps

No further action is required in relation to the injunction itself. KDDAUK may continue with:

- Ongoing governance consolidation
- Preparation for the civil claim regarding misappropriated funds
- Recovery of organisational property and records

CLC will continue to support the Committee through the next stages of the civil litigation.
